## **Patty Stanley Inducted Into the NAAA Hall of Fame**

Patty Stanley, co-owner of two ServNet auction facilities (Carolina Auto Auction and Indiana Auto Auction) and ServNet's chairman of the board, was inducted into the NAAA Hall of Fame during the association's 68th NAAA/NRC Convention, held in Las Vegas in November. NAAA has given the honor each year since 1968, recognizing those who have worked for the improvement of NAAA and have consistently followed the high standards of the association's Code of Ethics. Patty Stanley joins her husband Henry Stanley, a former NAAA president, who was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2013.

Patty has been in the auction industry since 1969, when she and her husband purchased Capital Auto Auction in Columbus, Ohio. After renaming it the Ohio Auto Auction, the Stanleys sold the auction to GE Credit and bought the Fort Knox Auto Auction in 1990, renaming it the Carolina Auto Auction. In 2007 the Stanley auction family expanded with the purchase of the Indiana Auto Auction in Fort Wayne, IN.



Her focus on customer service, consistency and operational excellence has shaped the success of both auction facilities, both of which have been frequently cited for superior performance by the national remarketing community. Carolina Auto Auction has been named top auction in the nation five times since 2005 for BB&T, a record eight times for FISERV/RSA, and three times for Donlen. In its first year of eligibility, Indiana Auto Auction placed second in RSA's rankings in 2011, following up in 2012 as number one in the nation. The auctions have won numerous other first place awards for Wheels, ARI, UACC, and CAC.

Patty's dedication to the auction business extends to the industry as well. She has served as the Southern Zone President of the NAAA, has chaired the Convention Committee multiple times, and has worked tirelessly as a member of the NAAA's Board of Directors. She is also known for her commitment to building a strong future for the next generation. She has not only worked hard to establish the NAAA's Warren G. Young Scholarship Foundation, but, with her husband Henry, also founded two of its annual scholarships. She and Henry also took the lead as executive sponsors of the newly-formed *Auction Academy*, which is designed to train the next generation. Patty was recognized as one of the Women in Remarketing in 2013.

She has played a significant role in ServNet's leadership, and currently handles responsibilities as ServNet chairman of the Board. She has also served as the group's treasurer, secretary, vice president and president.

"I join with all the ServNet auction owners in congratulating Patty Stanley as the newest member of the NAAA Hall of Fame," said ServNet's President Kevin Brown. "She has been an outstanding contributor to the remarketing community and auction industry, and has been a tremendous influence as a member of ServNet's board of directors.
